## MEMBER TYPES & DUES January 1 - December 31

- Group: Licensed physicians and allied health professionals including, but not limited to, registered nurses, nurse practitioner, clinical nurse specialists, pharmacists, physician assistants, social workers, and office managers in an oncology practice or univerisity. Dues: Up to 10 physicians \$750 (Small), 11-25 physicians \$1000 (Medium), 26+physicians \$1,500 (Large). All affiliated allied health professionals are complimentary.
- Regular: Licensed physician caring for patients with cancer. Dues: \$100.
- Allied Health Professional: Healthcare staff person including my not limited to, registered nurses, nurse practitioner, clinical nurse specialists, pharmacists, physician assistants, social workers, and office managers. If affiliated with a Group, Dues: Complimentary. If not affilated with a Group, Dues: \$50.
- Fellow: Physician enrolled in sub specialty training program to care patients with cancers. Dues: Complimentary.
- Retired: Former physician or allied health professional who is no longer practicing. Dues: Complimentary.
